## **USPS NEWS**

As most of you are aware with the rapid decline of First Class Mail, the Postal Service is consolidating its operations network to preserve the long term affordability of mail and to return the organization to financial stability. America needs a financially stable Postal Service to best adapt to a changing market place and evolving mailing needs. The steps we are taking now will put the Postal Service on a

strong financial footing for decades to come.

The Greater Boston District will be undergoing some restructuring during the month of September. An FSS machine was recently moved from South Florida and was installed in the Middlesex Plant. With this additional machine the Middlesex Plant will be taking flat volume that is currently being processed in the Northwest Boston Processing and Distribution Center in Waltham. In addition, one FSS machine will be moved from Northwest Boston to the Westchester District. This is the first of a three step process which will move all flat sequencing from Northwest Boston to Middlesex Essex. The letter delivery point sequencing operation for the 018 and 019 zip codes will move from the Middlesex-Essex Processing Distribution Center to the Boston Processing and Distribution Center. This will make Middlesex a flat and package sorting facility with Boston taking on all letter operations. An APPS machine was installed during the month of August in Middlesex. This move was primarily made to support our new Overnight Priority Mail Service. This machine will process all package and bundle work for the 018 and 019 delivery area.

We will continue to keep everyone updated with future processing changes.

## **Executive Mail Center Manager (EMCM) Program**

As part of our commitment to professional growth and education the Greater Boston Postal Customer Council presented the complete Executive Mail Center Management (EMCM) program last September. This was open to any PCC member, and we had 9 members of the Greater Boston PCC, 1 member from Western MA and 1 from the Southeastern MA PCC successfully participated and became EMCM certified. We also had two members completing recertification from Boston. This was hosted by Debra Visco, Manager of Distribution Operations at the New England Journal of Medicine, Massachusetts Medical Society, and was held September 11-13, 2012.

The EMCM program is usually available only through a residency program at the USPS Business Mail Academy in Norman, Oklahoma. The fee for the residency is \$1,500 plus the cost of air transportation to Oklahoma. The Greater Boston PCC brought Mail Academy instructors, and offered the program to members for only \$995.00. The enrollment included all program course materials as well as breakfast and lunch each day.

The EMCM program is a comprehensive training program designed for mailing industry professionals who wish to develop their mail center management skills. Developed by the U.S. Postal Service and the American Society for Training & Development, the EMCM program teaches the skills needed to manage more effectively, improve safety and security, boost productivity, and cut costs in the mail center. The program is made up of 8 modules dealing with business mail topics. At the completion of training there is a comprehensive exam. Those passing the exam, earn the certification "EMCM" which is a designation showing proven expertise in the mailing industry.
