

PCC CELEBRITY PODCAST WITH ANDRE GOWER: HOW FAN MAIL REVITALIZED HIS CLASSIC FILM



Andre Gower, Actor and Director, was the most recent guest on the Greater Boston Celebrity Video Podcast Series on October 27, 2021.

Guests on this PCC celebrity series always have an intriguing link to USPS and the mailing industry. Mr. Gower was no exception.

Andre was a child actor best known for his starring role in the 1987 cult classic, "The Monster Squad." Initially not a hit at the box office and unbeknownst to the cast and crew, The Monster Squad found its fanbase through the circulation of video cassettes. In 2006, Andre (along with the cast and crew) was invited to a reunion and screening of the film at the famous Alamo Drafthouse Cinema in Austin, Texas. He was shocked to see that there were 3 sold-out crowds waiting to see the movie and speak


to the cast. During the Q&A portion of the meet and greet, the most asked question was "Where is the DVD?" Fred Dekker, Director of The Monster Squad, answered, "Write letters to the studio...not e-mails...e-mail can be deleted...write First-Class letters." Pop Culture websites picked up the story and due to the massive number of letters, the studio released a 2-disc Special Edition DVD.

Life has not been the same for Andre since. Due to this resurgence, he spends most weekends on the road, traveling to different pop culture events, comic-con's or screenings of the film.

Andre directed a documentary entitled "Wolfman's Got Nards" (a nod to the most beloved line in the film) which chronicled how this forgotten movie from 1987 became a classic 20 years later. In the documentary, fans expressed their love for the film and how it changed their lives.

Andre took questions from the attendees. He answered questions regarding his iconic "Stephen King Rules" shirt worn in the movie. He talked about life as a teen idol in the 1980's and receiving thousands of pieces of fan mail every month. He spoke of getting so close to being cast in the films Stand by Me and Dead Poets Society. He also spoke of his decision to leave acting to pursue his dream of playing college basketball in North Carolina.

Andre Gower heaped praise on the USPS for helping to revitalize "The Monster Squad" so other generations can enjoy the film.



PREVIEW: Stamp Releases in 2022

The Postal Service has announced an amazing variety of stamps it plans to release in 2022.

- Year of the Tiger, the third entry in the 12-stamp Lunar New Year series, featuring a three-dimensional mask depicting a tiger;
- Blueberries, a 4-cent stamp featuring a cluster of blueberries;
- U.S. Flags, a stamp with an image of three flags in a circular formation, reminiscent of the 50 flags that surround the Washington Monument;
- Love 2022, the latest Love stamp release, featuring two designs of folk art-inspired flowers;
- Edmonia Lewis, a Black Heritage stamp honoring the esteemed 19th-century sculptor;
- Butterfly Garden Flowers, two nondenominated stamps featuring blooms that butterflies love: cosmos and scabiosas;
- Mountain Flora, four stamps featuring images of colorful alpine flowers: purple pasqueflower, wood lily, yellow alpine buttercup and Woods' rose;
- Eugenie Clark, a stamp honoring the marine biologist who sought to change public perception of sharks;
- Title IX, a stamp celebrating the 50th anniversary of the passage of the civil rights law prohibiting discrimination on the basis of sex in any educational program or activity receiving federal funds;

- Sunflower Bouquet, a 2-ounce stamp featuring a spray of sunflowers, irises and smaller posies in an elegant arrangement;
- Tulips, a stamp showcasing an assortment of the bulb flowers in an artful display;
- Women's Rowing, a pane of 20 stamps honoring women's achievements in the demanding water sport;
- Pete Seeger, a Music Icons stamp honoring the banjo-playing folk singer known for his activism;
- George Morrison, a pane of 20 stamps honoring a founding figure of Native American modernist art by showcasing five images of his artworks;
- National Marine Sanctuaries, a 16-stamp pane celebrating 50 years of the National Marine Sanctuary System;
- Elephants, a stamp showing a playful, affectionate illustration of a baby elephant and its mother beneath a bright orange sun;
- Mighty Mississippi, 10 photographic stamps of sites along the Mississippi River;
- Katharine Graham, the 17th stamp in the Distinguished Americans series, a 2-ounce denomination honoring the former publisher of The Washington Post; and
- Pony Cars, five stamps featuring pony cars of the late 1960s and early '70s.

"The new 2022 stamps are miniature works of art, designed to be educational and appeal to

collectors and pen pals around the world," said William Gicker, USPS Stamp Services director. "As always, the program offers a variety of subjects celebrating American culture and history. The vivid colors and unique designs of this year's selections will add a special touch of beauty on your envelopes."

The Postal Service announced the stamps on Nov. 1. The designs are preliminary and subject to change. All of the releases will be Forever stamps, unless otherwise noted. Additional 2022 stamps will be announced later.

OPERATION SANTA

The USPS Operation Santa program is now accepting letters for the 2021 holiday season. Since the program began 109-years ago, hundreds of thousands of less-fortunate children and families have been helped by the kindness of others.

USPS Operation Santa was started when the Post Office began receiving letters addressed to "Dear Santa" from kids across the country. Postmaster General Frank Hitchcock authorized local postmasters to allow postal employees to open, read and respond to these letters. In the 1940's, mail volume swelled, and the Post Office invited the public to help by writing responses and providing small gifts. The program grew over the years and in 2017, Operation Santa went digital. The public can now go online to

read through letters, adopting and fulfilling a child or family's holiday wish list. In 2020, the Operation Santa program received 23,860 letters and shipped 21,275 packages to children and families across the United States.
