What a summer it has been! Your Greater Boston Postal Customer Council won a trifecta of leadership awards in a national evaluation of PCC excellence conducted by USPS Headquarters.

The U.S. Postal Service recognized PCCs that achieved overall excellence in their efforts to serve their communities.



On July 12, 2022, representatives of 16 PCC's gathered in the Ben Franklin Room at Postal HQ in Washington DC for the event. The atmosphere resembled the Academy Awards. Those in attendance

understood they would likely receive an award but didn't know exactly which until called up. As each winner was called up, Judy de Torok, Vice President, Corporate Affairs, described the special contributions and strengths of each that made it a winner. A beautiful heavy glass trophy, the PCC "Oscar", was presented to each winner, followed by a photo op with Postmaster General Louis DeJoy.

INDUSTRY MEMBER OF THE YEAR - SILVER



Alice Gordon and Postmaster General DeJoy

Alice Gordon began her long association with the Postal Service in 1982 when USPS launched its paper-based electronic-originated mail service known as E-COM. Alice and her husband jumped in to license as an E-COM carrier to transmit electronic files of mass mailings for businesses to receiving Postal facilities where the files were turned into paper mail and dispatched. This was cuttingedge technology at the time before electronic communication became commonplace.

Active in the PCC almost from the beginning of this adventure, Alice has been part of the Boston PCC for 35+ years. She recruited small business participation in the PCC, served as Treasurer and then Co-Chair (1998-2000) and has remained on the Board since.

When the Executive Board was asked by the PCCAC to create a "History of the Greater Boston PCC" document, we turned to Alice. Even after all these years, Alice continues to make enormous contributions to the Greater Boston PCC.

Of Alice's many contributions to the Greater Boston PCC, the "History of the PCC" became her passion project.

- Alice jumped at the opportunity to produce (in her words) "the ultimate history of the Greater Boston PCC".
- She interviewed every past Industry Co-Chair for contributions to her document
- Alice scrolled through decades of old pictures to add to her "History" project
- She recovered articles from over the years and changing times to show the evolution of the Greater Boston PCC, going all the way back to the Congressional Record of 1968 and beyond.

In addition to her "History of the Greater Boston PCC" document, Alice is Chair of the Greater Boston PCC Communication Committee. She encourages innovative ideas and different ways to reach our audience – no idea is ever off the table.

As Editor of the quarterly Greater Boston PCC Newsletter, she proofreads and edits every article submitted to the Newsletter and writes some of them. A favorite was a beautiful article about the kindness of her local letter carrier which was printed in the PCC Newsletter. Alice's Letter Carrier article was so popular that it is now a recurring piece in our newsletter (highlighting a USPS employee) called "PCC Spotlight". (If you have a USPS employee to nominate for PCC Spotlight, please contact GBPCC. Our Newsletter is considered one of the best in the country...from recaps of previous of events to interviews with USPS Leaders, Alice oversees the entire process.

Alice gained PCC Headquarters recognition regarding her "Greater Boston History of the PCC". She was featured on the National PCC Day Video. PCC Liaisons called it "easily the best document of Postal Customer Council history submitted by any PCC in the Nation." It was also featured in the PCC Insider. The pride she exhibits in her work for the PCC is a guiding light and is what the Postal Customer Council is all about.

INNOVATION OF THE YEAR - GOLD

To increase membership and get National eyes on the Greater Boston PCC, an innovative form of communication to a widespread audience was sought. The Executive Board discussed starting a video podcast where celebrities would discuss their relationships with the mail over the years and why it remains a vital part of their lives. The Greater Boston Celebrity Video Podcast Series was born.

George Kippenhan, then the Greater Boston Consumer and Industry Contact Manager, would be the host and was tasked to sell the podcast to assorted "celebrities".

The format would be an hour discussion that included the journey of how our guest achieved their goal of becoming a professional in their field - actor, performer, singer, writer. A compelling USPS-based questionnaire would be asked of our guest.

- What Actor/Actress belongs on a stamp?
- What Moment in History belongs on a stamp?
- What athlete belongs on a stamp?
- What musician belongs on a stamp?

This questionnaire was fun and spontaneous for our guests. They enjoyed the idea of considering what someone would have to do to qualify for the immortality of appearing on a USPS Postage Stamp.

Finally, the discussion would end with the question; how has the mail helped you?

Our guests have been diverse, engaging, and excited to participate.

• Nick "Fitzy" Stevens - YouTube personality/Sports Radio Commentator

Mr. Stevens spoke about how he utilizes our Priority products to help him with his second business...selling t-shirts on his website. He states that no one can beat USPS pricing and quick delivery.

• Matty Blake - Actor/Host of TV's #1 Rated Cable Show "Drilling Down: The Curse of Oak Island"

Mr. Blake spoke about his love of the mail. He loves visiting his local Post Office in Barrington, Rhode Island and sending autographed 8x10 pictures to fans of the show.

• Jerry Thornton - Author/Barstool Sports/New England Patriots Beat Writer

Mr. Thornton spoke about the fabulous Media-mail rates that he utilizes in sending out his 3 best-selling books. The more poignant moment came when Jerry informed our audience that he had a son serving in Afghanistan for 5 years and oftentimes their only method of communication were letters. He spoke of how excited their family would be to receive a letter and how incredible it felt to hear that his son received a care package sent by them.

• Kerry O'Malley - Broadway Star (White Christmas/Into the Woods), Actress (Snowpiercer/Annabelle/Rounders) Ms. O'Malley spoke about how she and her friends started a letter-writing campaign for the 2020 Presidential Election during the Covid Pandemic. She estimates that 60,000 postcards were sent to voters in key swing states to advise them of the benefits of their preferred candidate.

• Andre Gower - Actor/Director/Producer

Andre was a child actor best known for his starring role in the 1987 cult classic, "The Monster Squad". Initially not a hit at the box office and unbeknownst to the cast and crew, the film found its fanbase through the circulation of video cassettes. In 2006, Andre was invited to a reunion and screening of the film at the famous Alamo Drafthouse Cinema in Austin, Texas. There were 3 sold-out shows with fans waiting to see the movie and speak to the cast. During the Q&A portion of the show, the most asked question was "Where is the DVD?" Fred Dekker, Director of The Monster Squad, answered, "write letters to the studio...not e-mails...e-mail can be deleted...write First-Class letters." Pop Culture websites picked up the story and due to the massive number of letters, the studio released a 2-disc Special Edition DVD. Life has not been the same for Andre since. Due to this resurgence, he spends most weekends on the road, traveling to different pop culture events, Comic-Con's or screenings of the film.

The Greater Boston Celebrity Video Podcast Series became an instant hit with our audience. Each video was uploaded to our PCC website and each has been viewed hundreds of times. Due to the diverse audience we had reached, our mailing list increased by 20%.
