USPS Unveils Special Olympic Stamp

The United States Postal Service (USPS), in celebration of the 2015 Special Olympics World Games, the flagship event of the Special Olympics movement, unveiled a national commemorative stamp on Thursday, July 30, 7:30 pm, at The Company Theatre, in Norwell, MA.

Mike Powers, USPS Greater Boston District Manager, was on hand to unveil the new stamp, and mark the occasion with The Company Theatre's Artistic Directors and many Special Olympic athletes who have benefited from the theatre's charitable generosity.

The Company Theatre was chosen as the unveiling site for their ongoing support, most recently by producing a benefit concert that raised more than \$6,000 for The All Town Tigers, a South Shore Chapter of Special Olympics. The presentation of the stamp was met with cheers by the 350+ in attendance and was immediately followed by a performance of the musical "1776."

Doug Jabara, who portrays Ben Franklin in the production of 1776, made an appearance (as Franklin) during the unveiling to which District Manager Powers quipped, "It's my old boss!" Ben Franklin was the first ever Postmaster of the United States. It was a fantastic evening for The Company Theatre, the Special Olympics and USPS.

He is a graduate of the Postal Service's Management, Executive Leadership and Associate Supervisor Programs. He is also Green Belt certified in the Lean Six Sigma process.



National Postal Forum

The Greater Boston Postal Customer Council was well-represented at the 2015 National Postal Forum, May 17 – 20, in Anaheim, CA. Approximately 30 Greater Boston PCC members went to the NPF to attend classes, visit exhibitors and meet with USPS Executives. The highlight of the conference was the keynote by Postmaster General (PMG) Megan Brennan on Monday morning. In her speech, PMG Brennan noted 3 key USPS innovations:

- Bridge the physical and digital world through the mail piece.
- Greater transparency through the Intelligent Mail Barcode (IMb) and Intelligent Mail Parcel Barcode (IMpb).
- Hyper-personalized mail via harnessing the power of big data, visibility and analytics.

In addition to attending, 5 members of the Greater Boston PCC Executive Board were presenters. Congratulations goes out to Board members Mark Fallon, Pat Ring, Jim Burns, Betsy Shortell and Steve Smith. The instructors were happy with the turnout, with class sizes ranging from 115 students to over 200 students at some sessions! Even for classes that started at 8:00am.
